Frankfurt Airport chooses Sensis Corp. in DeWitt for upgrade project

DeWitt, NY – The Frankfurt Airport in Germany has awarded **Sensis Corp.** a contract to expand and upgrade a system of sensors that allows operators to track the movement of aircraft and vehicles on the airport's grounds, the company said today.

Sensis is a privately held company and did not say how much the contract is worth.

Fraport AG, the airport's owner operator, will open a new runway in October and the new Pier A-Plus Terminal 1 next summer. It will open more ramp areas and a new Terminal 3 in the future.

In 1999, the Frankfurt Airport was the industry's first airport to use Sensis' sensor system to track the movement of aircraft and vehicles on the ground. Under the new contract, Sensis will replace all of its existing sensors and expand the coverage to the new runway, ramps and terminals.

Fraport predicts that at its current rate of growth the Frankfurt Airport will serve 65 million passengers a year within the next four years.

Sensis Corp. provides sensors, information technology, and simulation and modeling to air navigation service providers, civil aviation authorities, airports, airlines and militaries.
