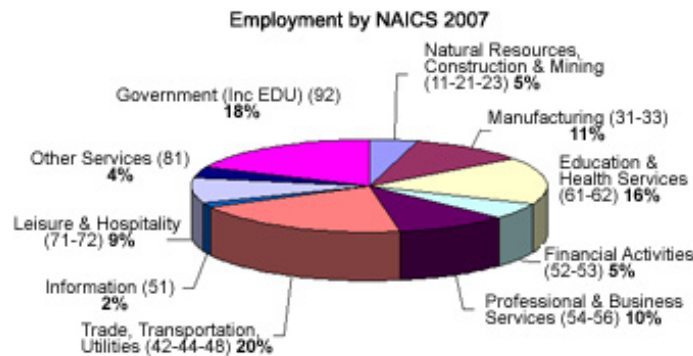

A recent study of the [underemployed](#) in the CNY area shows a significant additional pool of labor.
